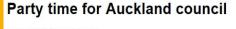

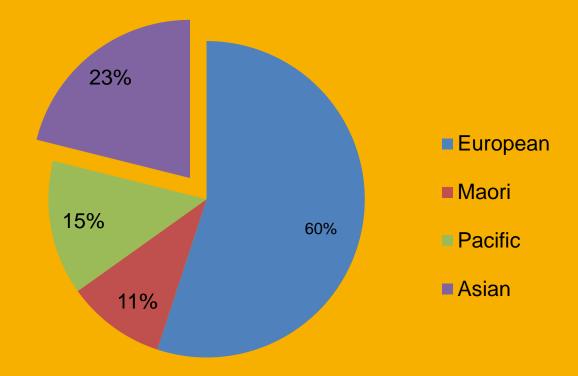

Auckland's diverse communities

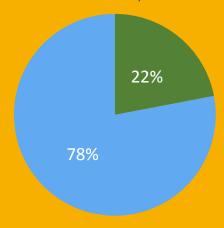






Only one in five Aucklanders say they have provided feedback to council in the last two years

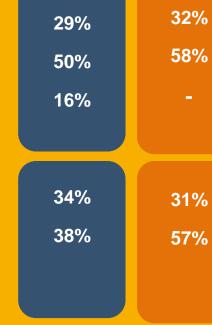

- A three-year interim Transport Levy established from 2015/2016.
- Resident rates to change
- Two existing CCOs would be replaced to establish Development Auckland which would take a more active role in urban redevelopment. The agency will be in place from 1 September 2015.
